

# GRANTS, AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FROM THE TEMPLE

## **I. The Florence Leff Memorial Endowment Fund**

Scholarships are made in loving memory of the late Florence Leff.

### CONFIRMATION

Upon the successful completion of the Confirmation Program, and thereupon graduation from Hebrew High School, candidates will be entitled to \$2,000 scholarship for participation in an approved Israel educational trip for summer 2007.

### TEMPLE BETH SHALOM HEY GRADUATION

Four merit scholarships for excellence in the study areas of Hebrew, Bible, History, and Religion. Candidates are selected by the Hey Faculty. The scholarship is in the amount of \$795, to be applied toward tuition of first year of Hebrew High School education, and is contingent upon enrollment. The scholarship is awarded at the Religious School Hey Graduation, and actually granted in the fall upon proof of enrollment in Hebrew High School.

In addition, the Leff Fund can be used to enhance our children's college Jewish experience for those students who have supplemented their studies with Jewish courses.

## **II. Warren B. Lieberman Memorial Camp Ramah Scholarship Fund**

Made available by the family of the late Warren B. Lieberman, in loving memory, to encourage children, with need, to enhance their Jewish experience by attending the summer program at Camp Ramah in the Berkshires. This scholarship will be granted in consideration of the financial needs of the applicant. Submit applications no later than March 1, 2007.

## **III. Temple Beth Shalom Sisterhood Scholarship**

### **A. COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP**

Scholarships for college courses in Judaica and/or Hebraica up to \$500 per course. Submit application for review and approval of course at the beginning of the term. These scholarships are granted upon successful completion of the course, ascertained by an official transcript.

### **B. AMIRAM DAVID COHEN SUMMER SCHOLARSHIP FUND**

Grants available for participants in the following summer educational programs and who are presently furthering their Jewish education:

1. Camp Ramah Summer Programs - USA and Israel
2. U.S.Y - Encampments, Israel and On Wheels
3. Israel Summer Trips - sponsored by J.E.A. under the auspices of the Department of Education and Culture of the W.Z.O.

4. Applications are received from the candidates whose mothers have been members of Sisterhood for two years prior to their current applications. Applications must be submitted NO LATER THAN February 28, 2007.

## **IV. Judith Victorsohn Rosenberg Scholarship**

This scholarship, made available in loving memory of the late Judith Victorsohn Rosenberg, is a merit competitive scholarship for a study program in Israel. Submit application no later than December 13, 2007.

## **V. Buzya Greenfield Award**

Made available in loving memory of the late Buzya Greenfield. This \$100.00 award is granted to an excelling Central Hebrew High School student of Temple Beth Shalom, upon recommendation of Central Hebrew High School.

## **VI. George M. Davis Memorial Scholarship**

Made available in loving memory of the late George M. Davis, this \$100.00 award is granted each year to an excelling Central Hebrew High School student who is a graduate of the Temple Beth Shalom religious school.

## **VII. Lester Community Service Award**

Made available by William Lester and his family, this award recognizes a Temple Beth Shalom teenager who is in the confirmation year (i.e. 11<sup>th</sup> grade) and who has committed himself/herself to community activities, specifically focusing on personal services and charitable projects. Weight will be given to those who have chosen to continue their Jewish education in a formal setting after their B'nai Mitzvah training. Submit applications no later than May 15, 2007.

## **VIII. Mercaz U.S.A. Scholarships**

Mercaz Israel scholarships, in the amount of up to \$600, will be available for use by one or more USY members of our Temple, who will participate in an Israel USY pilgrimage during the summer of 2007.

## **IX. Harriet D. Goldberg Memorial Fund**

This fund is dedicated to those students at university who will be pursuing careers in Jewish communal life; rabbis, cantors and educators. Wishing to inspire and encourage young people to become professional leaders in the Jewish community, this scholarship will help subsidize tuition fees in university courses which deal with and promote Jewish studies and Jewish career opportunities. It is the hope that this scholarship will help support the continuing involvement and expansion of committed Jewish leaders who will support and nourish the Jewish community into the next century.

Temple Beth Shalom is proud to have a hand in establishing this fund together with the Morton Goldberg family. Students who wish to apply for this scholarship must write to the Rabbi asking for funds and describe, as best as possible, the future career commitments of the student.
